This is a very rare type of post-Gupta base gold Dinar currency circulating in Western India, drawing inspiration from Sasanian coin designs. We don't know who was 'Jagaprakasha' whose name the coin bears, but chances are that he was an early Rajput ruler, likely of Hunnic ancestry. The motif of the 'illuminated Linga' on altar on the reverse is most interesting, and throws important light on how the Iranian Solar cult mixed with Shaivism at this time. The cataloguer is aware of only two other coins of this type in existence, one of which is in the collection of the American Numismatic Society, New York.







Humayun was forced to flee India under the Afghan resurgence led by Sher Shah Suri, and sought refuge with Tahmasp Safavi, the king of Iran. Tahmasp granted Humayun asylum on the condition he converts to Shi'ism. In 1545, a joint expedition under the charge of Humayun subsequently engaged Qandahar which was occupied by his rebellious brother Kamran. Humayun conquered the fort and city, nominally on behalf of Tahmasp. Both the facts - Humayun's conversion to Shi'ism and his vassalage to Tahmasp are reflected in legends on this coin. The conquest of Qandahar allowed Humayun a much needed strategic foothold to begin his re-conquest of India.

Akbar completed his first conquest of Gujarat in 1573 with the provincial capital based at Ahmedabad. However, for the first few years of Mughal rule, other mints in the province namely Malpur and Patan, a.k.a. Anhilwara, produced coins so that the new regime could achieve monetary assimilation of the newly acquired province into the Mughal monetary system. These mints also served to produce money for Mughal troops of occupation and further conquest into Kathiawad. Anhilwara, known to Mughal historians by its Islamic variant name 'Nahrwala', was the ancient capital of Gujarat and a centre of very important textile trade.

All issues of this mint, which appears to have functioned for only two years are very rare – the gold is exceptionally so.

Possibly, two more pieces exists in private hands.

The town of Mulher with its adjoining hill fort, presently located in Nashik district of Maharashtra, was the capital of the small Rajput kingdom of Baglana, strategically located on the trade route between Surat and the Deccan. In late 1637, the Mughal armies under Aurangzeb attacked Baglana with a view to separate the state from attempts of Shahaji Bhonsle to form an anti-Mughal alliance. Bahirji, the king of Baglana was defeated and accepted Mughal sovereignty in March 1638. Aurangzeb renamed the town 'Aurangnagar' after this victory.



The coin illustrated by Lingen is of a rather poor quality and also shows the flattening towards the edges like this specimen. However, he reports it to be of a full weight.

The couplet on the coin refers that it was struck "during the fortunate and contiguous reign of the most illustrious Queen of England, Victoria". The RY on obverse refers to the reign of Takhat Singh and corresponds to 1859, the year in which the Queen issued her Proclamation to stop hostilities after the Revolt of 1857-58 - an occasion which was celebrated by many Maharajas loyal to the British, Takhat Singh of Jodhpur being no exception.

This coin was published by S M Shukla and R T Somaiya in Numismatic Digest, vol. 2, part- I, June 1978 as "An Enigmatic Kutch Kori" (p.53-55). The authors contend to reconstruct the Devanagari legend as 'Mureed Raydha(na)' and connect it to a historical episode in Raydhanji II's reign wherein he came under the spell of an Islamic teacher named Syed Muhammad Panah of Delhi and converted to Islam. However, the reconstruction of the legend as proposed by the authors is not entirely free from doubt. Furthermore, if this coin were to be attributed to Raydhanji II the reference to Jalaluddin Akbar would be puzzling as there are more than 150 years separating the two. It is therefore likely that this coin is issued by a Gujarati potentate of Akbar acknowledging his suzerainty. It is possible that it could reflect political alignments just after the battle of Bhuchar-Mori in 1590.






