Ancient Maharashtra, Marathwada / West Vidarbha region - inscribed die-struck coin of Bhumimitra, (c.200-150BC), 14 unpublished in major sources, 2.83g. Obv: tree-in-railing flanked by three-arched hill and Shrivatsa to the right; Brahmi legend Bhumimitasa reading anticlockwise outwards above. Rev: bull walking to right, small 'Ujjain'-symbol above and traces of other symbols around. Very fine+, Very rare. Sold for : ₹ Estimate : ₹ 12,000 - 15,000

The coins of a king named 'Bhumimitra' are known mainly from Malwa and in the inscribed punch-marked series from East Vidarbha. The two might not be the same ruler, but this is the first instance of a 'Bhumimitra' coin in the die-struck series from Maharashtra to have come to light. He could well be the same ruler who issued punch -marked coins further to the East.

The coin is evidently overstruck on a previous type. The symbols suggest a Satavahana orientation but the name of the ruler clearly ends in '-Mitra'. These two features of the coin may have a political bearing.

Alauddin Muhammad is famously known as the conqueror of the Yadavas of Devagiri to usher in a wave of Islamic conquests in Southern half of India. His first attack on Devagiri happened soon before his accession as the Sultan, which reduced the Yadavas as a vassal state. The Sultan's armies subsequently vanquished the Kakatiyas, the Hoysalas and the Pandyas. The earliest coins struck in his name at Devagiri (Deogir) Mint are towards the end of his reign, after King Ramachandra Yadava died in c. 1315. This coin bears no date, but it has the same title that Alauddin held on his other coins - 'The Second Alexander'. It is struck to the Yadava standard of an 'Asu' and as such is potentially the earliest Islaimic coin in the Deccan.

Shams ud-Din Da'ud Shah II, son of Mohammad Shah II ruled between June 14, 1397 - Nov 15, 1397. He was installed on the throne by Taghalchin, a Turk noble of low origin, who was then made the Malik Naib and Mir Jumla by the Sultan. Taghalchin tried to persuade Shamsuddin to imprison Firoz Shah and Ahmad Shah and asked the king's mother to have them executed. On hearing of the conspiracy the two brothers fled to Sagar. Firoz Shah proclaimed himself king and made his younger brother Prime Minister. He attacked Gulbarga and killed Taghalchin. Daud II was blinded and allowed to move Mecca. He died in 1414 AD at Mecca.





The birds on both sides of this coin are locked in 'hunt' in terms of design context. The falcon on the obverse swoops, with his wings close to his body to prey on the quail, shown cowering among the letters on the reverse. The spread-out talons of the falcon, ready to grasp the quail, are very clearly shown under his belly. On this coin the falcon is shown perched on a branch, looking back, indicating it has either accomplished the kill, or it is about swoop on his victim. This is a very rare variation, noticed so far only on a couple of pieces. The design might have had a connotation with Mughal campaigns against the Nizam Shahi Sultanate.

Kishtwar is by far the one of the rarest mints, not just for the coins of Jahangir, but for the entire Mughal coinage. So far, only one specimen has been recorded, in an article published by Nicholas Rhodes in ONS-170 in 2002. Kishtwar was a small Hindu kingdom to the South of the Kashmir valley, mostly semi-independent throughout its 400 years' existence. It served as a refuge for the last dynasty of the Sultans of Kashmir after the Sultanate succumbed to a Mughal invasion under Akbar (1586). Early in Jahangir's reign, Bhup Singh the king of Kishtwar successfully repelled a Mughal army (1606). The kingdom was finally conquered by the Mughals in 1619, when Gaur Singh the successor of Bhup Singh, was captured and his capital plundred.

The date on this coin, however, is intriguing, as it corresponds to August 1615 – a period in which Kishtwar was not a subject to, nor invaded by the Mughals. Bhup Singh, the only ruler to have ruled without any Mughal interference, ruled over it till 1618. Nick Rhodes suggests that the coins were prepared in anticipation of an invasion which could not happen because of an outbreak of plague. Curiously enough, no coins of Kashmir mint struck in the same year are known but the similarity of the Kishtwar coin with issues of Kashmir mint is very evident.

When Jahangir died on 28 Safar, AH 1037 in Kashmir, his powerful courtier Asaf Khan feared the Queen Nur Jahan would place on throne her favourite son Shahryar as the new king. He enthroned Bulaki, the son of Jahangir's second son Khusrau, as 'Dawar Bakhsh'. The Khutba was read in Dawar Bakhsh's name at Bhimbar. His position was bolstered by his brothers and cousins joining him. Asaf Khan first defeated Shahryar's army on the outskirts of Lahore and then having secured Shah Jahan's agreement, proclaimed him as the emperor on 2 Jumada-I 1037. The puppet Dawar Bakhsh was killed along with his brothers and cousins who had sided with him by Shah Jahan's orders on 26 Jumada-I 1037, thus bringing his short reign to an end.


This is a very curious coin of 'Aurangabad' mint. The more familiar Aurangabad in the Deccan struck coins at this time with the honorific 'Khujista Bunyad' as the mint-name. It is strange that it must have reverted to 'Aurangabad' only for year. It is plausible therefore that this coin must have been struck at another place named 'Aurangabad'. There are many contenders but a place now located in the Pakistani Punjab province is a very likely candidate.

The coin also shows a curious AH/RY mismatch. It is possible that even though it i struck in the name of Muhammad Shah, the RY it bears refers to Nadir Shah dated from his accession in AH1148. This would be well explained in the context of the Punjabi Aurangabad - the Nawab of Punjab, Zakariya Khan had virtually accepted the suzerainty of Nadir Shah. He is a thus possible candidate for striking this unique coin.
