Coins of type similar to this were reported from the Sonepur Hoard, found at Sonepur, district Balagir in Orissa. Rajgor (p. 113) mentions the hoard but does not list the coins in his catalogue.

Almost two decades ago, R Krishnamurthy published extremely rare coins of the same type, with legends *Makkottai* and *Kuttuvan Kottai*, attributing them to Chera rulers Kottampalattu Tunjiyam Makkotai and Vel Kezhu Kuttuvan of c. 2st century BC. This coin clearly bears the same name-ending ('Kottai'), however the part of the ruler's name before the last two words is distinctly different than that seen on the coins published by Krishnamurthy. The third visible letter appears to be the Tamil 'Zh' appended with a vowel sign of 'u' under it, but it could also be a 'Ñ' sound, as seen in the *Kuttuvañ Kottai* legend. As such, it is evident that this is a silver coin of a hitherto unknown Chera ruler and thus, greatly significant to Numismatics of ancient Tamilakam. Further research involving a deep reading of Sangam texts is needed to arrive at a conclusive attribution of the coin.

The dynasty of Nikumbhas is known to have ruled in South Gujarat – Khandesh – North Maharashtra region on the evidence of four copper-plate grants. From these grants we learn that Bhanushakti was the founder of the family. Bhanushakti might have been invested by the Chalukya emperor Pulakesin II with the government of Southern Gujarat after the defeat of the Kalachuri king Buddharaja. His son was Adityasakti and the latter's son was Allashakti. Allashakti was ruling in 656AD. In his grant, Allashakti claims to have won royal rights and assumes the titles *Prthivivallabha* and *Nikumbha*. Allashakti's son Jayasakti also is called 'Nikumbha' in his Mundkhede copper-plates. The name survives as the present day 'Nikam' among the high-caste Marathas.

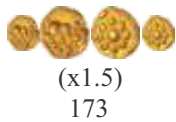

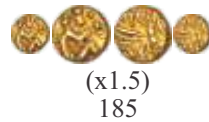

Shams ud-Din Da'ud Shah II, son of Mohammad Shah II ruled between June 14, 1397 - Nov 15, 1397. He was installed on the throne by Taghalchin, a Turk noble of low origin, who was then made the Malik Naib and Mir Jumla by the Sultan. Taghalchin tried to persuade Shamsuddin to imprison Firoz Shah and Ahmad Shah and asked the king's mother to have them executed. On hearing of the conspiracy the two brothers fled to Sagar. Firoz Shah proclaimed himself king and made his younger brother Prime Minister. He attacked Gulbarga and killed Taghalchin. Daud II was blinded and allowed to move Mecca. He died in 1414 AD at Mecca.

'Aurangnagar' was the name given by Aurangzeb to the town of Mulher with its adjoining hill fort, presently located in Nashik district of Maharashtra, which was the capital of the small Rajput kingdom of Baglana, strategically located on the trade route between Surat and the Deccan. Aurangzeb, while in office as the viceroy of Deccan under his father the Emperor Shahjahan aggressively pursued a campaign against the rebellion of Shahaji Bhonsle who had resurrected the Deccani Sultanate of Nizamshahi by elevating a boy prince to the throne to create a bulwark against Mughal expansion. In late 1637, the Mughal armies attacked Baglana with a view to separate the state from attempts of Shahaji to form an anti-Mughal alliance. Bahirji, the king of Baglana was defeated and the kingdom was annexed to the Mughal province of Khandesh. The conquest was complete with Bahirji accepting Mughal sovereignty in March 1638, and agreeing to convert to Islam.

The curious title "upholder of the trust of English government" is suggestive of the role played by the Maharaja by siding with the British during the Revolt.

The town of Shuja'alpur, located about 90 Km from Bhopal, originally belonged to the Sindhias, but went through a transient phase of occupation by Bhopal, during the 2nd Anglo-Maratha War, courtesy the political alignments and predatory campaign carried out by Wazir Muhammad Khan. In 1808, it fell to the Pindari leader Karim Khan, who operated on behalf of Daulat Rao Sindhia. The British confirmed it to the Sindhias at the end of the 3rd Anglo-Maratha or 'Pindari' War.

Silver rupees struck during the Bhopal occupation are exceedingly rare with less than five pieces known to have survived. On them, the symbols of Bhopal affinity are clearly evident.

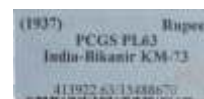

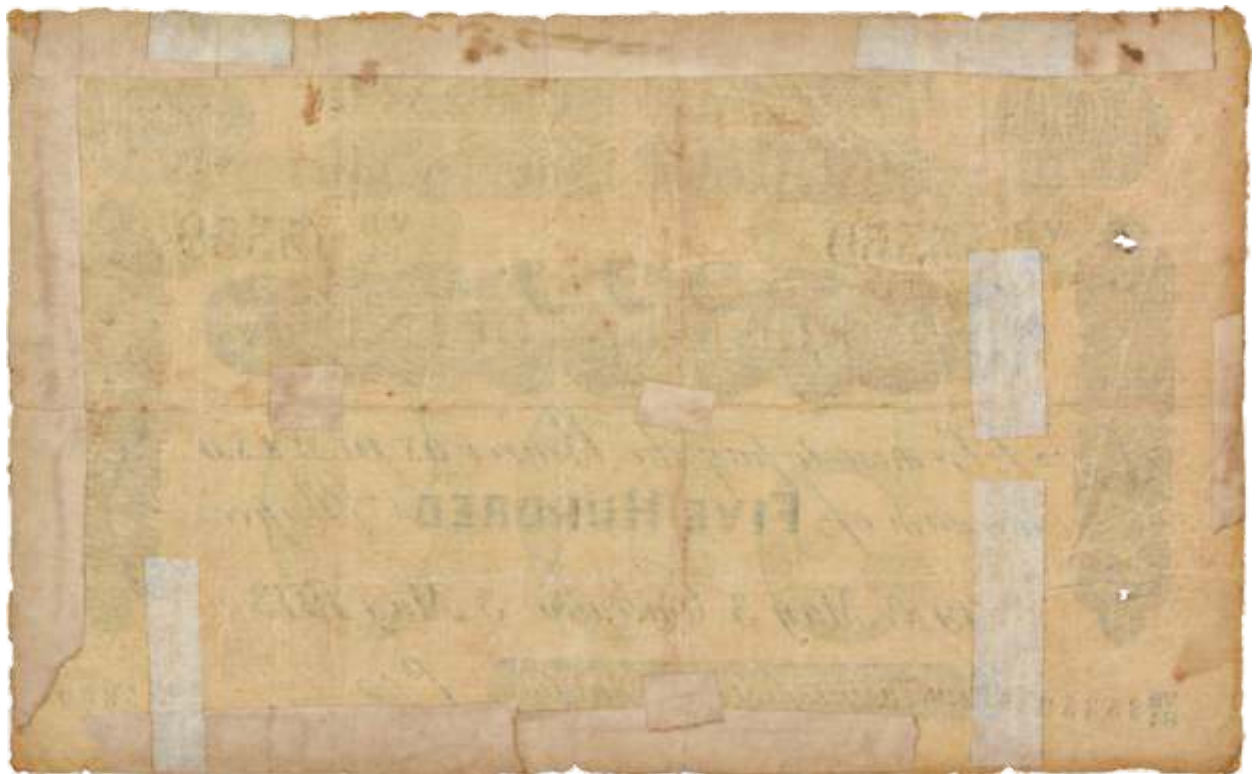
