Even though the coin does not bear a mint-name, the style of engraving and decoration make it absolutely certain that it must have been a product of Ahmedabad mint. Akbar's silver coins, struck to the local Kori / Mahmudi standards in local types are known from South Gujarat / Baglana and Kathiawad / Junagarh areas. However, this coin bears witness to the fact that Koris were also struck at the imperial mint in Ahmedabad; perhaps, their issue was prompted by demands arising from military campaigns in the mid-1590s which resulted in complete subjugation of Gujarat following the rebellion of Muzaffar III.

During fifth to seventh year of his reign, Jahangir issued gold coins with his portrait which according to historical sources of the time, "were given to (his) favorites, confidantes and eminent visitors to the court, as a sign of special grace, so that the recipient(s) could wear them on their person, on a sash or in their turbans, to proudly display their favored status". Although issued for a ceremonial purpose the coins were struck to a monetary standard and thus had every chance of entering the circulation. The portraits show the Emperor with one hand resting on a balustrade covered with a cloth, or carrying a globe, or a cup. The last is often regarded as a 'wine cup' and taken as a reference to the Emperor's most famous affliction. The portrait comes as an ultimate heresy from the Islamic viewpoint - firstly it shows the king in person in defiance of Islam's abhorrence of animate / iconic depiction, and then it shows him consuming a forbidden substance! It is therefore a unique instance of Jahangir's particularly lax and uninhibited attitude towards his own religion.

The coin offered here has been worn through ritual use. Perhaps, it remained in the recipient's personal shrine and was passed on in his family, and must have been washed and scrubbed thousands of times in domestic Pooja rituals.

During 1615-1619, Jahangir moved his court to Ajmer for three years to conduct campaign against the belligerent Ranas of Mewar. During this period, he is known to have held court several times, gone on royal hunts, and paid visits to shrines of various holy men. There are many references of coins being scattered each time the king processed through streets to ward off the 'evil eye'. This coin, bearing a poetic allusion meaning 'light scattering', was undoubtedly struck for one such occasion.

Burhanpur became the bridgehead for a number of campaigns launched by the Mughals to subjugate the Nizamshahi Sultanate. Court rituals and alms-giving for the success and welfare of soldiers were regular features in the camp and largesse coins, such as this one, were struck there in many types.

The town of Mulher with its adjoining hill fort, presently located in Nashik district of Maharashtra, was the capital of the small Rajput kingdom of Baglana, strategically located on the trade route between Surat and the Deccan. In late 1637, the Mughal armies under Aurangzeb attacked Baglana with a view to separate the state from attempts of Shahaji Bhonsle to form an anti-Mughal alliance. The coins dated 1219 have an oblique milling, suggesting the blanks were rolled through a milling machine, before they were struck. Henderson has commented on the milling evident on other coins of Tipu Sultan as being a vestige of employment of French artisans. According to Jan Lingen's scholarly paper in JONS, attempts were made to introduce mechanised coin production in Hyderabad around 1894AD, with the first machine-struck coins, dated AH1312, being brought into circulation during that year. This coin, unlisted in any publications, proves that the attempts actually extended back to AH1294 or eighteen years prior to this. Several companies were interested in setting up machines at the Nizam's mint and attempts were also made to purchase machinery from the decommissioned British mint at Madras. This coin is a significant marker for the history of mechanised coin production in Princely India.

Like some other states, Indore experimented extensively with mechanised coin production in 1887, perhaps prompted by the coronation of Shivaji Rao in the previous year. Many designs were patterned and a few were put through the production line - however, unlike most patterns which were used solely for experimentation, there is room to believe that some patterns struck during these trial runs ended up in circulation. This was perhaps because the state couldn't afford to waste metal it had imported only in trials. This rupee is such an example even though the fact that very few such rupees exist suggests this was a trial strike, it shows tell-tale signs of having been circulated.




