Possibly the rarest of the 'Gajalakshmi' types from the uninscribed die-struck coinage series of post-Mauryan Vidarbha, the iron-rich alloy used to make coins of this series was most likely mined in the mineral-rich areas of East Vidarbha.

This is a very rare type of Krishna's gold coins, known so far from only a handful specimen. All coins known so far show a deep die crack on the reverse, and the legend below the 'archer' motif truncated. This is the first specimen which has a very faint die crack, but a very clear legend on the reverse. Dr C S Gupta, on basis of truncated legends had opined that it refers to Lakshmi, the queen of Krishna Deva. However, his view always remained questionable given the fact that the queen's name would ostensibly have no connection with the depiction above it.

On this coin the legend quite clearly reads *Weesalamari*, which means 'killer / attacker of Weesala'. In all likelihood it refers to Krishna's campaign against the Vaghela king Visaladeva of Gujarat. Although Visaladeva was not actually killed by Krishna, he was certainly defeated after a major battle. The coin appears to have been issued as a commemorative piece to celebrate this victory.

Sultan Dilawar, fl. 1617-1665 ruled Sandwip Island, a few miles off the coast from Chittagong. Sultan Dilawar was appointed governor of the island by the Arakanese in 1617 and was ultimately captured, at the age of about 80 years, by the Mughal forces of Aurangzeb in 1665. He was then imprisoned in Dhaka (Jahangirnagar), where he died soon afterwards. This is the only coin that is known to have been produced for the little island of Sandwip. As per the discussion in G&G, the coin is attributed to Dilawar acknowledging the suzerainty of Kyaw Htin, the governor of Chittagong. The last word of Arabic legend visible on this coin has not been read in G&G as the coin illustrated by them does not show it.

Coins in the name of Azam Shah were struck for a brief period when he assumed the kingship on 14th March 1707 at Ahmadnagar, ten days after the demise of his father Aurangzeb. As he had been active in the provinces of Berar, Gujarat and Malwa immediately before this event, most mints striking coins in his name are located in these regions. His coinage ended with his defeat and death at the hands of his stepbrother Muazzam at the battle of Jajau on 8th June 1707. AH1118 is extremely rare, only known for Ahmednagar mint so far. The coin is probably struck while the king halted for 3 days at Aurangabad towards the end of 1118.
