II.16.1.2, 4.30g. **Obv:** Four punches, 1x 'Star of David' with dots between angles, 1x four-armed whorl and 2x elephant facing to right. **Rev:** Minor bankers' marks, including a bow-and-arrow. *Very fine, Very scarce*.

The combination of punches does not find any parallel in GH. This coin appears to have been partially re-struck on the reverse of a series-I coin

3. **Archaic silver punch-marked coin,** Wainganga-Mahanadi Divide, sometimes attributed to 'Vidarbha', 'Chedi' or 'Kalinga' Janapada, ABBC configuration, light ½ karshapana standard, (300-200 BC), 1.21g. **Obv:** Four marks, 1x elephant, 1x a pair of oxen yoked to a plough and 2x four crescents and dots surrounding a circle. *Very fine+*, *Rare*.



The city of Kurara has been identified with modern Kurwai near Vidisha and features in several donative inscriptions at Sanchi.

It is extremely unusual to find Kharoshthi legends on a coin struck so far to the East. There are more than one kings named 'Jyeshthamitra' known in the monarchical coinage of Vatsa region. This seems to be the earliest of them all.



The coin shows traces of being either counterstruck on an under type, or double-struck with the same die.

It is not known to which dynasty the king Gautamiputra Vishakhadatta belonged but it is certain that he must have risen to power in the aftermath of the Satavahana power being gradually eliminated from Vidarbha and the regions of Central India immediately to the North. A power struggle appears to have erupted here with the Maghas, the Nagas and the Vakatakas contesting for supremacy.

28. **Post- Satavahana Karnataka**, uninscribed lead coin often attributed to the 'lion Maharathis', (200-250 AD), 6.77g. **Obv:** Lion standing facing right with tail curled over its back. **Rev:** Beautifully executed Shrivatsa symbol. *Extremely fine, Very rare.*

This is the first time a bull-type coin of Chutukulananda is ever reported. It is most likely struck in the Chandravalli region, located to the South of Banavasi, where 'bull' type coins of local Maharathis had been in circulation.

The period between about 1530 and 1550 was chaotic in Kashmiri politics, with the rivalry between the local Chak dynasty, the Kashghari occupants and the Mughals under Humayun who later made the Kashghari noble Haidar Dughlat their vassal, all fighting for power. Nadir Shah was crowned three times in this turbulent period. Gold coins of his very short-lived third and final reign have hitherto not been known, until this coin surfaced. The fact that it belongs to his third reign is confirmed from its stylistic similarity with the coins struck in the name of Humayun by Haidar Dughlat, which immediately preceded this issue. A rare and important coin of an ephemeral reign.



This is an unusual coin in terms of its design, date of issue and mint. Unlike other coins of Akbar, it has a 'crescent'-like mark at the end of the word 'Muhammad' on obverse and the Shahada here is enclosed in a circular margin. Its date of issue (AH 993) is much too late for the usual run of issue of coins of the 'Shahada' type, and it appears to have the epithet 'Baldah' (visible at 6 o'clock on the reverse) for the mint -name. 'Baldah' is known for the mints of Agra, Sahrind and Kalpi for Akbar's coinage but the very small remnants of the mint seen to the left of the word do not appear to fit any of these. Instead, it is tantalizingly plausible to infer from the vestiges that the mint-name is 'Banaras'. Whichever way one looks at it, this is an interesting and unusual coin.





Coins of this type were previously attributed to the Marathas, owing to the 'Nagfani' symbol often encountered on Maratha rupees of Pune mint. However, in recent times, this attribution has come under scrutiny and this particular coin conclusively proves that the type was struck after the Maratha rule had come to an end. It is most likely a component of the 'Kachcha' currency circulating all over Berar and Marathwada regions, owing to a stimulus in demand for small copper coins to make payments to the labourers in cotton farming industry.



Towards the end of his reign Shivaji launched his famed 'Southern conquest' to settle disputes with his step-brother Venkoji of Thanjavur and to gain his share of their father's jagir lands. Alberto Gomes, in his book 'Moedas Portuguesas' illustrates a Spanish 'Pillar' 8-Real coin - popularly called as 'Spanish Dollar' - which is counter struck with a similar mark (Gomes 70.01). A counter struck 'Maria Theresa Dollar' is mentioned by Gomes but he does not illustrate it. While Gomes remarks that the style of the crest is 'similar to the coins of Malacca', on the coin offered here it looks very close to the one encountered on late 18th century Indo-Portuguese copper coins of Diu. The 'Maria Theresa Dollar' was a popular trade coin in the Arabian Peninsula, an area which has had long trading links with Gujarat. It is therefore possible that this coin arrived in Gujarat via Arabia and then was countermarked by the Portuguese in Diu, with a view to make it into a 'Dollar' of their own to facilitate trade further east.

Awadh was declared an 'independent kingdom' on 9th October 1819 and Ghaziuddin Haider, the Nawab-Wazeer was now conferred with the title of 'King' by the East India Company. His coronation marks a break from the Indian courtly culture. He chose to adopt European symbols of kingship and was the first Indian king to do so. Thus, his crown and coat-of-arms have a clear European design. The designs for this medal and Ghaziuddin Haidar's coinage were made by court artists Roshan Lal and Jamiyat Rai. The latter chose to sign his work with the letter 'Jim' which is not present on this piece, so this must have been the artwork of Roshan Lal. 

Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF) was the Indian military contingent performing a peacekeeping operation in Sri Lanka between 1987 and 1990. It was formed under the mandate of the 1987 Indo-Sri Lankan Accord that aimed to end the Sri Lankan Civil War between Sri Lankan Tamil nationalists such as the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) and the Sri Lankan military.

One of the IPKF's most memorable battles was the liberation of Jaffna in late 1987, codenamed 'Operation Pawan'. The fiercest battles between the Indian Army and the Tigers were fought at Kopai North, Kokuvil and Kurruparai. An evacuation attempt at Urelu in December also saw a lot of action. The medal no doubt commemorates the bravery of Indian soldiers fighting the LTTE.

The system of 'model prisons' was advocated in the Prison Reforms Committee of 1946 to try experimenting with "latest principles of penology" and where "latest sociological principle of penal reform are incorporated". The Lucknow Central Prison was converted into a model prison' in 1949. Here the inmates were allowed to mix freely with least surveillance and there was no social, psychological or physical isolation. They were also given basic education and trained in various vocational skills, such as dhurrie-making, pot-making, dairy farming, papermaking and spinning yarn on the Charkha. At an establishment named 'Ganga Bhawan', the prisoners had their own canteen. The prisoners got paid for their work and they paid for their own food. Evidently, these tokens were issued to facilitate such monetary transactions inside the prison. The effigy of Mahatma Gandhi is appropriately placed on the token, as his broader ideas about Humanity and Ethics were at the root of founding 'model prisons'.


