1. **Megalithic cultures in the Deccan**, gold ornamental diskette said to have been recovered from a river bed in Karnataka, (2000-1500 BC), 2.61g. *Extremely fine, Extremely rare.*

Such diskettes were used for stringing into a necklace. They are very similar in style and fabric to those from a large hoard found in May 2000 at Mandi in Muzaffarnagar dist, western Uttar Pradesh, attributed to the Indus Valley Civilization (mature phase). However, this diskette does not have a milled edge, like many of the Mandi specimens.

Although the coin is uninscribed, its attribution to the Rashtrakutas is certain as evident from the choice and comparison of the motifs to other Rashtrakuta coins, and with contemporary visual art. Most likely the rulers to have issued the coins are likely to be Govinda III (793-814AD), Amoghavarsha (814-878AD) or Krishna II (878-914AD). The Rashtrakutas established trade links with the Arabs and greatly patronized the trade in horses. The access to the Western coast gave them direct control over these connections and made their army more powerful than their rivals like the Pratiharas. The depiction of a horse-riding king is very significant in this respect.

Under his command, the Chola armies marched against the Chalukya king Someshwara of Kalyana, sacking the provinces of Gangawadi and Rattawadi en route. He also led campaigns to Sri Lanka, Kerala and faraway Malay peninsula. This coin is significant also because of the reverse depiction, which in all probability is that of a Garuda. If so, it is highly unusual because Virarajendra is sometimes identified as a persecutor of Vaishnavism.

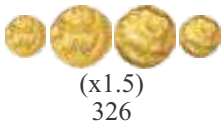

Akbar completed his first conquest of Gujarat in 1573 with the provincial capital based at Ahmedabad. However, for the first few years of Mughal rule, other mints in the province namely Malpur and Patan, a.k.a. Anhilwara (known to Mughal historians by its Islamic variant name 'Anharwala' or 'Nahrwala'), produced coins so that the new regime could achieve effective assimilation of the newly acquired province into the Mughal monetary system. The products of these mints also served to produce money for Mughal troops of occupation and further conquest into Kathiawad.

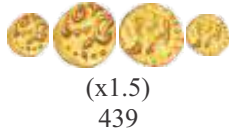

Coins from this mint are a recent discovery. They were most likely struck during a tumultuous period of succession battles between various nobles of the 'Mughalia' faction at the court of Shah Alam II, namely Afrasiyab Khan, Abdul Ahad Khan, Zain al-Abidin Khan and Muhammad Beg Hamadani. The year on the coin corresponds to late November 1783 to mid-October 1784. During this period, there was intense rivalry brewing between Afrasiyab Khan and Muhammad Beg. The latter had confiscated much of the area West and South of Agra, including Braj. Afrasiyab sought the help of Mahadaji Sindhia to quell Muhammad Beg's insubordination.

Shergarh is located to the South-East of Mathura and is an important crossing point on the Jamuna between Mathura and Aligarh. During these struggles, it is known that Muhammad Beg once crossed the Jamuna after encamping at Shergarh and went towards Jaipur.

The coin bears close resemblance with the rupees of the Jats struck at Deeg and it is likely that Muhammad Beg Hamadani might have struck them during this short stay at Shergarh. In all likelihood this must have been an emergency issue, made to payments to the troops fighting on Muhammad Beg's side.

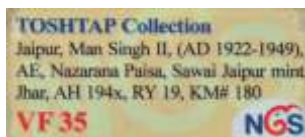

The legends on these extremely rare rupees were tentatively deciphered by John Deyell in an article published in the Journal of Academy of Indian Numismatics & Sigillography, Vol.III 1980, pp.57-60. On 12th April 1686, King James II renewed the East India Company's charter after the establishment at Bombay suffered a rebellion by Capt Richard Keigwin who took over the control from the Company in the name of the King. Along with addressing causes of discontent, and with a view to streamline the trade, the charter permitted the Company with "full power license and authority to coin in their forts, any species of money usually coined by the Princes of these countries", provided they matched the standards of such coins in terms of weight and fineness. It is probable that coins in Mughal style bearing the name of James II were struck at this time, to alleviate the frustrations caused by English-style 'Pax Deo' rupees, which traders on the Konkan mainland and beyond were very reluctant to accept.

Similar rupees have been offered in other auctions as issues of the English East India Company, struck in Bombay in the name of Charles II; however, research by Paul Stevens has completely ruled out this attribution. The coins do show a similarity with British issues of William and Mary in terms of execution, but legends on them have not yet been satisfactorily read. They appear to an inscription in a non-Persian language, perhaps a European one, rendered into stylised Farsi script. It is quite likely that they are issues of a different European mercantile company that operated on the Western Coast of India. In this context it is interesting that this coin, at the bottom of the obverse inscription, appears to have something like '...dej' which could be a part of 'Walandej', the Persianate term used to describe the Dutch.

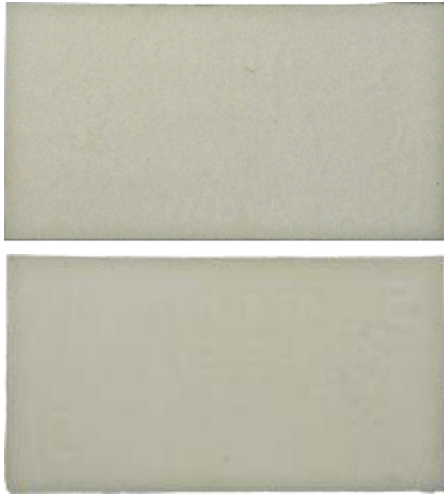
