1. **Archaic silver punch-marked coinage**, **Son valley** series, attributed to 'Vatsa Janapada', (c.500-400 BC) - silver karshapana, Hardekar 2019 - SN. 20 and 21, 2.99g. **Obv:** Four symbols in ABCD configuration - 1. 'scorpion' with taurine in it, 2. sun, 3. elephant standing facing left, 4. six-armed symbol. **Rev:** traces of an undertype. *Extremely fine, Very rare*. Sold for: ₹ 8,000 - 10,000

2. **Archaic silver punch-marked coin** - 'Narhan hoard' or **'Ghagra-Gandak River Valley'** region type, commonly attributed to 'Shakya Janapada', (c.400-350 BC), 5-Shana or 1½ Vimshatika standard, Rajgor 523, 6.53g. **Obv:** Single deep punch of a pentagon symbol with large central dot, a few small ancillary punches, including a tree in railing, around. **Rev:** Plain. *Good Very fine, Rare*.

In his recent study on archaic punch-marked coins from the Deccan, Prashant Kulkarni has drawn interesting parallels between the 'pellet' symbol and megalithic funerary architecture.

6. **Post-Mauryan independent dynasts, Vidarbha** region (c.250-200 BC) - iron-rich alloyed uniface coin of **'elephant'** type, not listed in PAIC, 22.22g. **Obv:** Elephant walking to right with arrow coming out of its back. **Rev:** Plain. *About Extremely fine, Very rare*.

The iron-rich material of this interesting series of coins was probably sourced from iron ore belt to the south/east of Vidarbha in the Wainganga valley.

7. **Post-Mauryan independent dynasts, Vidarbha** region (c.250-200 BC) - uninscribed iron-rich alloyed uniface coin of 'elephant' type, not listed in PAIC, 6.80g. **Obv:** Elephant walking to right with trunk raised; taurine, arrowhead and treskelis above. **Rev:** Plain. *Good Very fine, Rare*.

The iron-rich alloy used to make coins of this post-Mauryan Vidarbha series was most likely mined in the mineral-rich areas of East Vidarbha.







8. **Ancient Vidarbha/Marathwada** - die-struck copper coin of a hitherto unknown city state **'Bhadrapurika'**, (c.200 -150 BC), not listed in any publication and unique so far, 3.43g. **Obv:** Bull standing facing right, small 'Ujjain' symbol above and Swastika to right; Brahmi legend *Bhadapurika* below. **Rev:** Six-arched hill with river below, a left-facing peacock to right. *About Extremely fine, Unique so far*.

This is the first instance that a coin bearing the city-state name 'Bhadrapurika' is being offered at an auction. The precise location of Bhadrapurika is yet to be determined - however, considering that 'Bhadra' was a dynastic name it is plausible that the city had a context with the Bhadra rulers. Another city-state, perhaps with a similar context, was Bhadravati in Vidarbha.

9. **Ancient Marathwada/West Vidarbha** - uninscribed die-struck coin of pre-Satavahana period, (c.200-150 BC), a new type not listed in any source, 7.58g. **Obv:** Elephant with trunk raised facing right, simplified Nandyavarta and 'Ujjain' symbols above and to right, respectively/ the motif enclosed in an ornate double rectangular border with Swatikas. **Rev:** A tree-in railing in a rectangle with taurines in all corners. *Extremely fine, Extremely rare*.



Only a few specimens of this rare type are known to exist, including two in the British Museum and one in the Bode Museum, Berlin. The depiction of Mahasena, Skandakumara and Vishakha as separate individuals on this coin shows that during the Kushan period, these three were regarded as separate deities. About three hundred years later, during the Gupta period, they fused into Karttikeya, the son of Shiva, who retained their 'war-god' character. It is not known what precisely 'Shri Seraha' means, even though the legend is pretty clear on this coin. It is of a type very closely modelled on the coins of Vengi Chalukya ruler Vishnuvardhana VI alias Vishama Siddhi so it is plausible that it is an issue of one of his successors, most likely Jayasimha I (641-673 AD).

Rare examples of 'bull' type Vishnukundin fabric coins of early medieval Northern Maharashtra are known to have animal reverses, instead of the usual Kalasha motif. A peacock, an elephant, a horse and a lion are known. The legend on this coin is tentatively read as 'Kanta Vigra' and this might suggest a new king with a '-Vigraha' ending name.

The Nikumbha dynasty is known to have ruled in South Gujarat - Khandesh - North Maharashtra region on the evidence of four copper -plate grants. From these grants we learn that Bhanushakti was the founder of the family. Following him, three other rulers are known -Adityashakti, Allashakti and Jayashakti. The dynastic name 'Nikumbha' survives as the present day surname 'Nikam' among the high caste Marathas.

It is evident from the legend that the coin was issued by a king whose name began with 'Vi' and ended in 'Deva'. It is not certain to which dynasty he belonged but it is possible that he was a Rashtrakuta feudatory, judging by the Garuda emblem.

The name of Kshillika appears in verse 290 of the fifth book of *Rajatarangini*, the historical chronicle of Kashmir, written by Kalhana. She was the grandmother of Chakravarman who was put on the throne as a baby in the tumultuous aftermath of Sugandha Rani's reign, during which soldiery named as the 'Tantrins' controlled Kashmir. Kalhana mentions that Kshillika ruled as a regent for the boy king for ten years, after a short period of regency by Bappatadevi, who was Chakravarman's mother. With the discovery of a coin in her name, we add one more name to coins issued by female rulers in Indian Numismatics.

Gangas of Talakadu came into existence simultaneously for the first time in Karnataka around mid-fourth century CE. They were the contemporaries of the Kadambas of Banavasi and ruled from Gangapadi-96000 or Gangavadi. The Ganga dynasty lasted for nearly 650 years with 27 rulers known so far from the available epigraphs. Their crest was Madagajendra lanchchana, the lordly elephant in rout. While they were in frequent war with the Nolambas, they had matrimonial relationship with the Nolambas too. The coin is attributed to Satyavakya Kongani Varma Permanadi Marasimha, who wore too many titles such as Gangavajra, Ganga kandarpa, Nolamba Kuantaka, the destroyer of the Nolambas. Marasimha was a feudatory of Rashtrakuta Krishna-III.



The Matsyas was an ancient dynasty of Mahakoshala region about which very little information is available. They served as feudatories to Chalukyas of Kalyani and to the Chhindaka Nagas of Chakrakota (Bastar) at various times. The attribution of this coin to the Matsyas is based on the punch with the dynastic emblem.

The reign of Someshvara II was plagued with two problems - the ambitions of his brother Vikramaditya VI to become the emperor and an invasion by the Cholas. Eventually, Vikramaditya managed to depose Someshvara. Coins of this monumental 'temple' type were also struck by Jayasimha II, the predecessor of Someshvara II; however this is the first time a coin issued by Somshvara II in such a type has come to light.

Lenka Koma means the Feudatory chief or the commander of the army. The Kakatiyas ermerged as independent ruler in the late 12th century CE and prior to it, they were the feudatories of the Chalukyas of Kalyana. 

Nur ud-Din Muhammad Jahangir (1605-1627 AD)



The emperor Jahangir struck a remarkable series of figural type rupees and mohurs, unprecedented for a Muslim ruler. In his autobiography, he mentions he got an idea that instead of inscribing the name of the month of issue on his coins - a feature introduced by his father, the emperor Akbar - he would show the sun sign for each month. Thus, a series of zodiacal types was struck, each sign corresponding to the month of issue. The obverse dies were reused from year to year, but new dated reverses were produced for each subsequent issue. The 'Zeenat Dad' couplet, seen on the reverse of this coin, was used only for the first year of issue the combination AH1028/RY14. The coins were struck from mints wherever the Emperor was in residence and are known for the mints of Agra, Ahmadabad, Ajmer, Fathpur, Kashmir and Lahore. They were considered to be heretical by Jahangir's successor Shahjahan and recalled from circulation - however their immense beauty and novel conceptual designs made them collector's items even during their circulatory life. They are perhaps the most sought-after Mughal coins and have remained so for nearly four centuries.






