The 'Ayodhya' series is one of the rarest of North Indian archaic punch-marked series with very few surviving specimens known.

Similar coin was sold in 2011 in Baldwin's Auction 71, Lot no. 1246 at hammer 1,200 GBP.



Archaic silver punch-marked coin, Gomti-Ghagra River Valley region, usually attributed to Ayodhya Janapada (c.600 -400 BC), Vimshatika standard, similar to MATEC 2167-2182, 5.01g. Obv: One large punch of lotus symbol and a side punch of otter/mongoose. Rev: Blank. *Good Very fine, Exceedingly rare*. Sold for: ₹ Estimate : ₹ 40,000 - 50,000

The 'Ayodhya' series is one of the rarest of North Indian archaic punch-marked series with very few surviving specimens known.

Similar coin was sold in 2011 in Baldwin's Auction 71, Lot no. 1246 at hammer 1,200 GBP.



The 'Kashi' series fractions are extremely rare varieties of archaic punch-marked coinage. They most probably served as subsidiary denominations of the larger 'scyphate' fabric coins, struck to the full Vimshatika standard.

The reign of Sugandha Rani ended in chaos. She was heavily under the control of mercenary soldiers called 'Tantrins' and 'Ekangas'. She selected Nirjjita varman, son of Sukha varman and grandson of Shura varman, to be the king, in the hope that being her relative, he would act according to her directions. But Nirjjita varman was a physical handicap and used to squander money. The Tantrin infantry then deposed him and installed his son Partha on the throne ('Rajatarangini of Kalhana Pandita: Vol 1', translated by Jogesh Chunder Dutt, London, 1887, p. 123-124)





Chakravarman was yet another child-ruler; he went on to rule for ten years (till 933/934), for a few months under the regency of his mother and then, under grandmother Kshillika. A new revolution by the Tantrin soldiery then installed Suravarman I; he ruled for about a year before being compelled to abdicate the throne, after failing to raise the demanded bribes. The Tantrins then re-installed Partha but deposed within a very short time-span, as Chakravarman promised the Tantrins with even greater riches. 

According to the Ain-e-Akbari, by Abu'l Fazal Allami, the chronicler of Akbar's reign, the emperor thought that everything in this world should have a Sanskrit name. There were names given to each denomination of gold and silver coins of Akbar's reign which derived inspiration from the Indian tradition. Section 10 of the Ain-e-Akbari, gives a comprehensive list of coins under the title "The Coins of the Glorious Empire". A round shape mohur was called 'Ilahi' and the square shaped heavy mohur Lal-i-Jalali or simply 'Jalali'. The 25 tola mohur, being 1/4th of the 100 tola mohur called S'hansah, the heaviest denomination gold coin, was called as 'Atmah', 1/2 mohur weight of a Jalali was called as 'Dhan', weighing 6g, while the ¼ mohur weight was called as 'Man', weighing 3g. Very few fractions of the Dhan and Man coins are known in gold explaining their extreme rarity. For detailed information, kindly refer Chapter 10 of Mughal Numismatics by Mitresh Singh.

Aurangzeb imposed Jizva or poll-tax/safety money' on select non-Muslim population in AH 1090/RY 22. The tax was to be paid by three categories and in three sums - the 'poor' were to pay "3 Tolas, 1 Masha plus 0.45 and 1/20th of Masha" of silver, the middle classes twice this amount and the rich, four times. The sums in equivalent Dirhams were going to be 12, 24 and 48 Dirhams respectively. These quantities were in accordance with prescriptions laid down by Islamic Law or Shari'a but since there were no 'Dirhams' current in India, special coins were struck to facilitate the collection of the tax. They remain an interesting aspect of Mughal coinage and as such as are highly collectible. Since the coins were issued very sporadically, they are also very rare.



'Tirchanapali' on the coin is modern Tiruchchirappalli. Extremely rare Mughal style coins were struck bearing this mint-name after 1693 -94 when Mughal forces under Zulfiqar Khan, while pursuing a campaign against the Maratha Chhatrapati Rajaram, who was besieged at Gingee, threatened Queen Mangammal, the regent of the Nayaka kingdom of Madurai, whose capital at the time was based at Tiruchchirappalli. The queen warded off the Mughal danger by paying a tribute, some of which might have been paid in form of these coins which were struck to acknowledge her obeisance to the Mughals. The mint is the southernmost place to have struck Mughal coins.

The village of Dhamoni is located in Banda tehsil of Sagar district, Madhya Pradesh. It was a strategic stronghold securing the North-South route in Mughal times and a seat of a provincial Mughal officer. In the 18th century the area became a hotbed of military and political activities involving the Mughal subahdars of Malwa, the Bangash Nawabs, the Bundelas and the Marathas. In the second decade of the Muhammad Shah's reign, when this coin was struck, a major tussle ensued between Chhatrasal Bundela and Bahlol Khan the Mughal commander of Malwa. Chhatrasal pushed Bahlol Khan towards Dhamoni and occupied it. It is possible that coins were struck here around this time to fund the campaign.

These coins were probably struck under the authority of Nawabs of Rajahmundry and Srikakulam who was feudatory to the Nizam of Haidarabad, during a period of uncertainty following the death of Nizam ul-Mulk Asaf Jah I in 1749. This couplet is known only for the mints of Dilshadabad and Imtiyazgarh for coins struck in the name of Alamgir II. Ostensibly, the mint of Dilshadabad (Narayanpett) was run at the behest of the Hindu raja of this *Samsthana*, feudatory to the Nizams of Haidarabad.


Kalyan or Kalyani was the seat of a Nawab feudatory to the Nizams of Haidarabad. This is probably the earliest issue of the mint, struck during a period of uncertainty in which the Nizam virtually became a vassal of the Marathas, until in 1760, Nizam Ali Khan put an end to the succession disputes that had raged since the death of Asaf Jah I.

The 'Fazl-i Ilahi' couplet is known only for Koilkunda, a very rare mint that struck coins in the name of Ahmad Shah and Alamgir II, during the decade of uncertainty following the death of Asaf Jah I in 1749. Anupnagar-Shahabad is perhaps the rarest Mint of Awadh, known from not more than 3-4 specimens, including one in the British Museum from the RB Whitehead collection. The location of this Shahabad is not certain, but it is most likely Shahabad near Qanauj. The name 'Anup nagar' indicates that the issue of the coins was probably linked with the powerful courtier Anup Gir Gossain, a.k.a. Himmat Bahadur, who served as an important mercenary commander in the army of the Nawab of Awadh. The mint mark of Trisul corroborates this connection. The Gossains were famous as 'warrior ascetics' and renowned for their valour.

In 1885-86, the state of Baroda found itself under increased pressure from the imperial government to stop its mint producing hand-struck coins known as 'Babashahi' rupees. To alleviate this situation, the Maharaja Sayaji Rao III decided to mechanise the coinage production and introduce milled or 'Kaldar' rupees. As a precursor to launching mechanised production, several attempts were made to prepare dies and patterns were struck. One of the designs of these patterns, dated VS 1943, was struck modelling the coins on British Indian design with a bust on obverse and a value within a wreath on the reverse. A few strikes of this design are known in copper. However, this is the first time that a pattern in a non-copper metal has come to light and it has the last two digits of the date missing suggesting they were to be put on the final dies using movable punches. As such this is an important 'missing link' in the history of mechanized coin production at Baroda.


